## SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

Inhalation: Dust inhalation: In case of problems: Move into fresh air and keep at rest. In case of persistent throat irritation or coughing: Seek medical attention and bring along these instructions.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothes and rinse skin thoroughly with water. In case of eczema or other skin disorders: Seek medical attention and bring along these instructions.

If not breathing give artificial respiration. Unconscious persons must be locked on their side, head low and kept warm. Call an ambulance.
